Vice Mayor Finnerty announced that she had to leave the meeting at 7:40 p.m. to travel to a Florida League of Cities conference.

Kevin Hughes, Gulf Boulevard, spoke about the PSTA bus stop at Cabrillo.

City Manager Rey addressed the bus stop issue and Commissioner Friszolowski addressed the flooding issue.

4. Consent

- a. Request approval of the special event application request for road closure on Pass-a-Grille Way and 8th Avenue on December 7, 2019 for the Pass-a-Grille Boat Parade.
- b. Request approval of the special event application for a beach fire on Pass-A-Grille Beach December 12, 2019.
- c. Request approval of the applications for CABA's 2020 events and street closures: Seafood Festival, Mardi Gras, St Patrick's Day, Crab Fest, (5) Summer Series events.
- d. Request approval of the proposal from Hall-Mark RTC in the amount of \$181,500, for the purchase of a Rescue vehicle (Rescue 23) with funding provided by Pinellas County EMS Authority.

Commissioner Pletcher moved to approve the Consent Items 4(a), (b), (c), and (d) as submitted. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Finnerty and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

Commissioner Friszolowski requested a photo be provided to Commissioners when requesting approval to purchase a vehicle.

5. Action Items

- f. Pass-a-Grille Holiday Boat Parade

Item 5(f) was added by Commissioner Pletcher.

Commissioner Pletcher requested funding for the Pass-a-Grille Boat Parade in light of the City Boat Parade being cancelled this year.

Unidentified speaker commented about raising the Corey Avenue bridge.

Commissioner Pletcher moved to approve Item 5(f), to approve \$1,500 towards the Pass-a-Grille/Vina del Mar Boat Parade, with the idea that the City will look into extending it next year. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Finnerty and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- a. Request Approval of Change Order No. 5 to the purchase agreement with Gibbs & Register, Inc. for Blind Pass Road Reconstruction from 75th Avenue to Gulf Boulevard in the amount of \$294,355.84.

Public Works Director Mike Clarke explained the change order includes additional projects relating to the utility conduits, roadway, potable water, and signalization. An additional 48 workdays will be added to the project completion date.

Commissioner Izzo moved to approve Item 5(a), approving Change Order No. 5 to the purchase agreement with Gibbs & Register, Inc., for Blind Pass Road Reconstruction from 75th Avenue to Gulf Boulevard in the amount of \$294,355.84. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Finnerty and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- b. Request approval of Change Order No. 18 to the purchase agreement with Gibbs & Register, Inc. for the Pass-a-Grille Way Reconstruction from 1st Avenue to 19th Avenue in the amount of \$149,369.32.

Mr. Clarke noted Change Order No. 18 includes five separate projects relating to the roadway, wastewater, and potable water infrastructure.

Commissioner Pletcher moved to approve Item 5(b), approving Change Order No. 18 to the purchase agreement with Gibbs & Register, Inc., for the Pass-a-Grille Way Reconstruction from 1st Avenue to 19th Avenue in the amount of \$149,369.32. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Friszolowski and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- c. Request approval of Change Order No. 19 to the purchase agreement with Gibbs & Register, Inc. for the Pass-a-Grille Way Reconstruction from 1st Avenue to 19th Avenue in the amount of \$106,992.52.

Mr. Clarke explained the Phase II of Pass-A-Grille Way Reconstruction Project change order bundled five separate items including additional concrete work, the removal of an abandoned concrete seawall underneath Pass-a-Grille Way, asphalt repairs, fire hydrant installations & relocation, and changes to the Pinellas County water scope.

Commissioner Pletcher moved to approve Item 5(c), approving Change Order No. 19 to the purchase agreement with Gibbs & Register, Inc., for the Pass-a-Grille Way Reconstruction Project from 1st Avenue to 19th Avenue in the amount of \$106,992.52. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Friszolowski and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- d. Request approval of the cost estimates from Rowland, Inc., under the existing On-Call Civil & Large Pipeline Contractor Services Agreement, for Boca Ciega Isle Drive stormwater improvements, reclaimed water service line replacements, and street resurfacing, in the amount of \$869,453.00.

City Manager Rey explained the improvements are the result of fulfilling a commitment to the residents in the Boca Ciega Isle Drive area. The three project areas include the stormwater improvements, repair of the reclaimed water line laterals, and repaving of the street.

Commissioner Friszolowski moved to approve Item 5(d), approving the cost estimates from Rowland, Inc., under the existing on-call Civil & Large Pipeline Contractor Services Agreement, for Boca Ciega Isle Drive stormwater improvements, reclaimed water service line replacements, and street resurfacing, in the amount of \$869,453.00. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Izzo and unanimously approve by a roll call vote.

- e. Request approval of the Service Agreement with Waste Connections, Inc. for City Wide Solid Waste Services.

In response to a Request for Proposals, three companies submitted bids for solid waste collection services. City Commission previously authorized the City Manager to enter into negotiations with Waste Connections of Florida, Inc., which includes an option for residents to schedule a special pickup of yard waste in excess of the two cubic yard limit.

Mark Grill, 2nd Palm Point, commented on subsidizing special services.

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Johnson called for a motion and the vote.

Commissioner Pletcher moved to approve Item 5(e), approving the service agreement with Waste Connections, Inc., for city-wide solid waste services. The motion as seconded by Commissioner Izzo and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

6. Ordinances

- a. Ordinance 2019-16, Final Reading and Public Hearing of an ordinance relating to Customary Use of Beaches and Public Access.

City Attorney Andrew Dickman recommended appealing the current ordinance that is preempted by Florida Statutes regarding the regulation of dry sandy areas of beach and

is also part of a settlement agreement with Silver Sands Beach and Racquet Club Master Association, Inc.

Hearing no audience comments, Mayor Johnson called for a motion and the vote.

Vice Mayor Finnerty moved to approve Item 6(a), Ordinance 2019-16, repeal of Customary Use Ordinance. An ordinance repealing Section 94-74 through and including 94-79 regarding customary use of beaches by the public on final reading, an ordinance of the City of St. Pete Beach, Florida, providing for repeal of Ordinance 2018-07 and Chapter 94, Article III, Division 1, Sections 94-74 through 94-79 of the City's Code of Ordinances relating to customary use of beaches and public access; providing for conflicts, severability, construction, publication, and an effective date. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Friszolowski and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- b. Ordinance 2019-XX; Authorizing the issuance of a bank loan not to exceed \$6,700,000 to fund the Police Officers' Retirement System pension liabilities.

Vince Tenaglia, Assistant City Manager, stated the process will allow for significant cost savings to the City for one of the three pension plans, from the current 7% to approximately 2-3% in the future.

Hearing no public comments, Mayor Johnson called for a motion and the vote.

Commissioner Friszolowski moved to approve Item 6(b), Ordinance 2019-XX, upon first reading, an ordinance of the City of St. Pete Beach, Florida, authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$6,700,000 principal amount of a taxable pension obligation revenue note (Police Officers' plan), Series 2019, to eliminate the unfunded liability of the City's Police Officers' Retirement System and to pay costs of issuance of the note; providing for a covenant to budget and appropriate legally available non-ad valorem revenues to pay debt service on the note; providing for the rights of the holder of such note; providing for conflicts, severability, construction, publication, and an effective date. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Izzo and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- c. Ordinance 2019-XX, First Reading and Public Hearing of an Ordinance Relating to the term "pervious", vegetative ground covers and non-vegetative material.

Community Development Director Wesley Wright provided information regarding the residential landscaping standards as they relate to vegetative and non-vegetative ground cover (stone, gravel, and shell), and the Planning Board comments and recommendations.

Hearing no public comments, Mayor Johnson called for a motion and the vote.

Commissioner Pletcher moved to approve Item 6(c), Ordinance 2019-XX, amending Division 2 - Definitions; Division 22 - Type, Quality, and Size of plant material regarding the term “pervious,” vegetative ground covers and nonvegetative material and Appendix “A” for the establishment of a fee for ‘work without a tree permit’, upon first reading, an ordinance of the City of St. Pete Beach, amending the Land Development Code, Section 2.1 - Words, Terms and Phrases Defined; Section 22.4 - Type, Quality, and Size of Plant Material; Section 22.14 - Tree Removal Permit Requirements; and amending Appendix “A” of the Code of Ordinances to provide for a ‘work without a tree permit’ fee; providing for codification; providing for severability; providing for repeal of ordinances in conflict; and providing for an effective date. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Friszolowski and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- d. Ordinance 2019-XX, First Reading and Public Hearing of an Ordinance Relating to Nonconforming structures that would allow for ordinary repairs and maintenance.

Mr. Wright explained that the proposed changes will codify existing practices that staff manages.

Hearing no public comments, Mayor Johnson called for a motion and the vote.

Commissioner Izzo move to approve Item 6(d), Ordinance 2019-XX, amending Division 3, Administration of the Land Development Code regarding non-conforming structures that would allow for ordinary repairs and maintenance; upon first reading, an ordinance of the City of St. Pete Beach, amending the Land Development Code, Section 3.10 - Vested Rights and Non-Conformities; and providing for severability; providing for repeal of ordinances in conflict; and providing for an effective date. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Friszolowski and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- e. Ordinance 2019-XX, First Reading and Public Hearing of an Ordinance Relating to Variances and providing for Practical Difficulty and Administrative Variances.

The hardship variance will continue to require full Board of Adjustment hearing and approval, or City Commission approval in the case of a conditional use permit. The practical and administrative variance relates to single family homes and the unnecessary and the administrative and undue hardship variance will apply to any property.

Hearing no public comments, Mayor Johnson called for a motion and the vote.

Commissioner Friszolowski moved to approve Item 6(e), Ordinance 2019-XX, amending Division 2, Definitions; Division 3, administration of the Land Development Code regarding variances and providing for practical difficulty and administrative variances, and Appendix A for the establishment of fees for the variances; upon first reading, an ordinance of the City of St. Pete Beach, amending the Land Development Code, Section 2.1 – Words, Terms and Phases Defined; Section 3.12 – Variances; and amending Appendix “A” of the Code of Ordinances to provide for unnecessary hardship, practical difficulty and administrative variance fees; and providing for codification; providing for severability; providing for repeal of ordinances in conflict; and providing for an effective date. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Izzo and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

- f. Ordinance 2019-XX, First Reading and Public Hearing of an Ordinance Relating to Appeals of the City Manager and to provide for an internal remedy to Board of Adjustment actions.

Mr. Wright explained the variance and appeals processes which applies to zoning permits but not building permits.

City Attorney Dickman recommended amending the ordinance as follows:

Hearing no public comments, Mayor Johnson called for a motion and the vote.

Commissioner Pletcher moved to approve Item 6(f), Ordinance 2019-XX, amending Division 3, Administration of the Land Development Code regarding appeals of the City Manager and clarifying that “permit” relates to zoning permits, not that of building permits; upon first reading, an ordinance of the City of St. Pete Beach amending the Land Development Code, Section 3.14 – Appeals; providing for codification; providing for severability; providing for repeal of ordinances in conflict; and providing an effective date, as amended to include Paragraph “A” only. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Izzo and unanimously approved by a roll call vote.

SCOPE/INTENT AND EXTENT OF SERVICES

1. PROJECT KICK-OFF MEETING AND SITE VISIT

Genesis Halff will attend an on-site project kick-off meeting with client's project manager to review specific parameters; identify available data which includes as-built drawings and existing utility information, or any other pertinent information within the project area.

2. TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY

A comprehensive design level survey will be developed for the project area identified in Attachment A. The survey will be within street rights-of-way and easements at a vertical accuracy necessary to provide an understanding of the direction of existing drainage patterns. This survey will also identify all above grade existing utilities information and invert/size/material of gravity piping when accessible and all other pertinent information required to develop design drawings. This scope is based on the expectation that the City will mark its facilities and request the same from any utility franchises located within the

right-of-way prior to initiation of field survey. NAD 83 (State Plane Coordinates) and NAVD 88 (datum for elevations) will be used to develop the survey.

The survey will be performed under the direct supervision of a Licensed Florida Land Surveyor. Surveys will be prepared in accordance with the Standards of Practice per the Florida State Board of Surveyors. The final deliverance will be an AutoCAD file.

It is also understood that this project will also qualify for a Federal approval via the FDEP State Programmatic General Permit (SPGP).

Genesis Halff will prepare and submit a request for verification of exemption to FDEP and a request for Federal authorization pursuant to the SPGP. Genesis Halff will also coordinate with PCWNA to document the seawall repair and that this repair meets the exemption criteria contained Sec. 58-573(2) of the Pinellas County Water and Navigation Regulations. For this permitting effort, Genesis Halff will respond to one Request for Additional Information from FDEP and one from PCWNA.

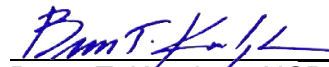

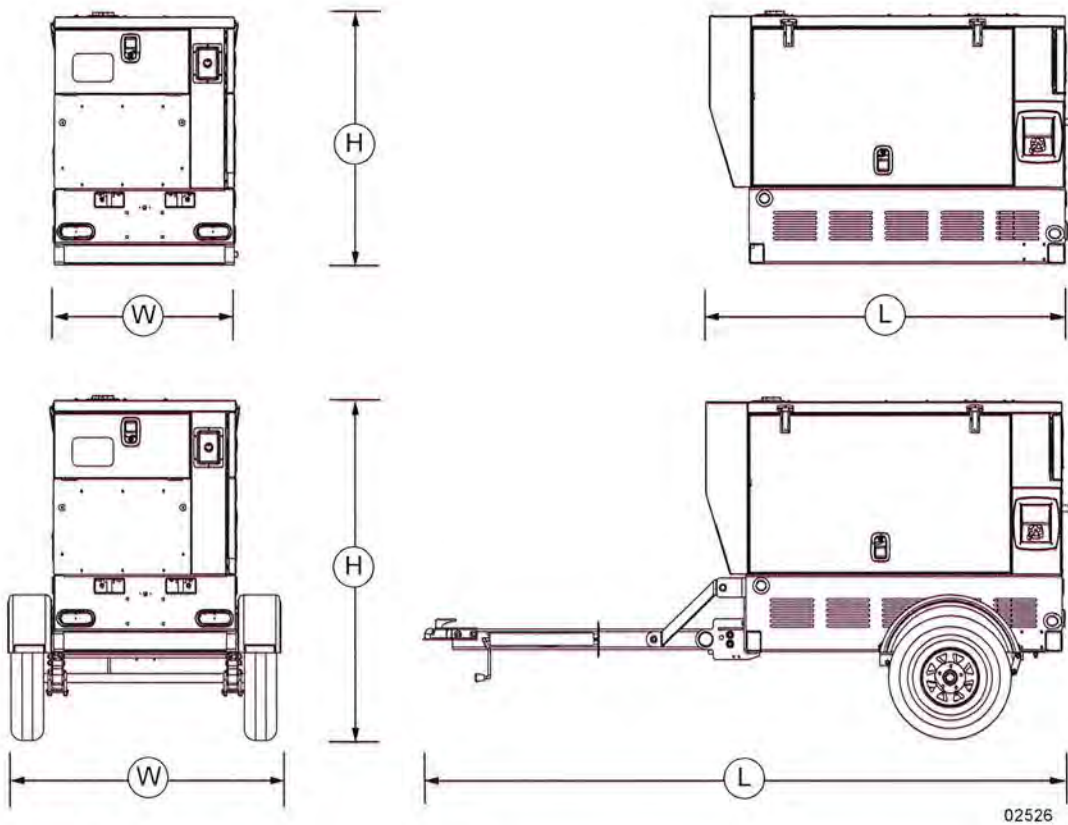

Summary of Issue: A Request for Bids (RFB) was issued on October 25th, 2019 for the St. Pete Beach Sanitary Sewer Capacity Improvements. This construction project includes the installation of approximately 15,000 linear feet of sanitary sewer force main and four new sanitary sewer lift stations along the Gulf Boulevard and the Gulf Winds Drive/Boca Ciega Drive corridor. Improvements associated with this project include roadway restoration, curb and gutter installation, sidewalk, resolving utility conflicts, installation of a new sanitary sewer force main, and new lift station installations.

The RFB instructed the four prequalified construction firms to submit pricing for three project schedule options. These options were an 18-month unrestricted schedule, a 12-month unrestricted schedule, and an 18-month schedule that restricted work on Gulf Boulevard during the period from February 1, 2020 through April 30, 2020 and during the period from February 1, 2021 through April 30, 2021.

On December 20th, 2019 the City received four sealed bid submittals. After a review of the bids and the requirements of the submittals, Bid 1 from Metro Equipment Service, Inc. was determined to be the lowest responsible bid, with an 18-month unrestricted project schedule.

Although bids were received for the two alternate project schedule options, these bid prices were more than \$1,000,000 more than the selected bid, and are not recommended due to the increased cost.

Based on the December 20, 2019 bid opening, estimated construction costs exceed the budget by approximately \$4.47 million. Following are staff's recommended budgetary actions to complete the project fund:

1. Reduce contingency estimates from ten percent to five percent. This is based on Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) policy to limit contingency funding upon completion of the construction bidding process. In the event actual contingency expenses exceed five percent, the State

Revolving Fund (SRF) loan agreement will be amended to include additional funds.

2. Appropriate \$531,416 as included in a corresponding ordinance on the January 14th agenda. This provides additional funding derived from prior year budget availability, with no negative impact to fund balance.
3. Transfer \$531,142 from budgeted debt service expense to the project fund. Based on the final SRF loan agreement, the first debt service payment is deferred to fiscal year 2022. This represents an intra-fund transfer utilizing existing resources, with no adverse impact to fund balance as compared to budgetary estimates.
4. Utilize \$256,465 in Wastewater fund balance which would have otherwise been applied towards fiscal year 2021 debt service expense. Based on the deferred loan payment schedule, these funds will not be required until fiscal year 2022.
5. Borrow the remaining balance of \$2,880,631 as required to complete the project fund. Staff recommends borrowing the difference, particularly due to the final loan terms which include a fixed interest rate of 0.22%. The net difference between the original loan terms (\$10,350,317 at 0.835%) and final loan terms (\$13,230,948 at 0.22%) is approximately \$114,159 per year. An option remains available for staff to reduce the rate to 0.12%, which would further reduce the annual impact by \$6,718.

SERVICES AGREEMENT

Sanitary Sewer Capacity Improvements

This is an Agreement (the "Agreement") entered into by and between the City of St. Pete Beach (hereinafter "City") and Metro Equipment Service, Inc. (hereinafter "Contractor"). The City and Contractor together shall be referred to as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, the City properly issued a Request for Bids, attached and incorporated hereto as Exhibit "A", and the City Commission authorized the selection of Contractor at its January 14th, 2020 public hearing; and

WHEREAS, City desires to purchase from Contractor the services described in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is in the business of providing the services described herein, and has submitted an appropriate proposal to the City to provide the same; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement has been properly approved by the appropriate authority of the City and the Contractor.

NOW, THEREFORE, upon the mutual covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration in the sum of Fifteen Million Six Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Two Hundred Twenty Five dollars (\$15,625,225.00) to be paid by the City to Contractor as herein provided, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereto hereby agree to the following:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct, and incorporated herein by reference.
2. Public Records: Contractor shall abide by the legal requirements set forth in Florida Statutes, Section 119.0701 and incorporated herein as Exhibit "B". **IF THE CONTRACTOR HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO THE CONTRACTORS' DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS AT (City Clerk, City of St. Pete Beach, Florida, 727-363-9220, cityclerk@stpetebeach.org, 155 Corry Avenue, St. Pete Beach, Florida 33706).**
3. City hereby agrees to purchase, and Contractor hereby agrees to provide, the services described in the bid proposal attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "C".
4. Contractor shall provide the services, described herein no later than 550 days from the effective date.
5. Time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement. City shall be entitled to liquidated damages in the amount of \$3,000.00 per day, for each day after the date set forth in paragraph 4 herein

that Contractor has failed to properly and completely provide all of the services specified herein. Contractor specifically acknowledges that the foregoing sum is reasonable and does not constitute a penalty.

6. Upon Contractor's full performance of the services, or in accordance with the payment schedule provided in the attached proposal, City shall pay Contractor as per the Unit Prices listed in the Bid Schedule, as full consideration for services provided in this Agreement and more specifically in Exhibit "C."

7. Contractor agrees to procure and maintain all permits and licenses which may be required by law in connection with the prosecution of the services contemplated hereunder, except for those permits obtained by the City. Notwithstanding the provisions above, the Contractor shall be responsible for non-compliance of all permit requirements, including all fines resulting from Contractor's non-compliance of said requirements.

8. Contractor agrees to permit any representative(s) of the City, at all reasonable times, to inspect the work in progress or any of the materials used or to be used in connection therewith, whether such work is located on or off the project site, and to furnish promptly, without additional charge, all reasonable facilities, labor and materials deemed necessary by the City's personnel, to conduct such inspections and tests as it may require.

9. Contractor fully warrants that all services provided herein have been provided in a good and workmanlike manner. Contractor guarantees said services for a period of 18 months from the date of final performance. Contractor shall provide all labor and materials necessary to repair any defective workmanship reported to Contractor within said guarantee period.

10. To the extent that this Agreement requires Contractor to provide any services of any kind, Contractor and all of Contractor's subcontractors shall maintain public liability insurance in a combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00, satisfactory to the City Manager, naming the City as an additional insured and providing coverage up through and including the final performance of any services provided herein. Contractor and all of Contractor's subcontractors shall maintain in full force and effect a policy of worker's compensation insurance for all of Contractor's employees in accordance with applicable state and federal law. Said insurance coverage shall include employer's liability with a single limit of \$100,000.00 per accident or occurrence. Contractor shall present City with a certificate for all of the foregoing insurance, at the time of executing this Agreement and at such other times requested by the City. The Contractor waives all rights against the City, the City's consultants, separate contractors, if any, and any of its subcontractors, agents and employees, for any and all damages caused to the extent covered by insurance described herein and obtained pursuant to this Section or other property insurance applicable to the services and product provided under this Agreement. The City shall require of the Contractor, Contractor's consultants, separate contractors, if any, and the subcontractors, sub-subcontractors, agents and employees of any of them, by appropriate agreements, written where legally required for validity, similar waivers each in favor of other Parties enumerated herein. The policies shall provide such waiver of subrogation by endorsement other otherwise. A waiver of subrogation shall be effective as to a person or entity even though that person or entity would otherwise have a duty of indemnification, contractual or otherwise, did not pay the insurance premium directly or indirectly, and whether or not the person or

entity had an insurable interest in the property damaged.

11. In consideration of the payment of ten dollars as part of the above purchase price, Contractor shall indemnify, defend and hold the City harmless for itself, its employees, agents and assigns, from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, suits, actions, or demands, including attorneys' fees and costs of litigation through all appellate proceedings, arising from the performance or non-performance of this Agreement, whether caused in part by the City or not.

12. This Agreement shall be binding upon the Parties, their successors, assigns, and legal representatives. Contractor shall not assign or otherwise transfer any of the rights or duties under this Agreement, without the express written consent of the City.

13. This document and exhibits embody the entire Agreement of the Parties. There are no promises, terms, conditions, or representations binding on either party hereto, other than those contained herein; and this document shall supersede all previous communications, representations, and/or agreements between the Parties hereto, whether written or oral. This Agreement may be modified only in writing executed by all Parties. This Agreement shall be construed according to the laws of Florida, and venue for any action arising herefrom shall be held in a court of competent jurisdiction located in Pinellas County, Florida.

14. The following Exhibits shall be attached, incorporated and made a part of this Agreement:

- a. Request for Bid (Exhibit "A")
- b. Florida public records law (Exhibit "B")
- c. Contractor's Bid (Exhibit "C")

15. The prevailing party in any action to enforce or interpret this Agreement shall be entitled to reasonable attorney fees incurred through all appellate proceedings.

16. Contractor hereby acknowledges that the person executing this Agreement on behalf of Contractor has the full authority to do so and to bind Contractor to the terms hereof.

119.0701 Contracts; public records; request for contractor records; civil action. —

(1) DEFINITIONS. —For purposes of this section, the term:

(a) “Contractor” means an individual, partnership, corporation, or business entity that enters into a contract for services with a public agency and is acting on behalf of the public agency as provided under s. 119.011(2).

(b) “Public agency” means a state, county, district, authority, or municipal officer, or department, division, board, bureau, commission, or other separate unit of government created or established by law.

(2) CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS. —In addition to other contract requirements provided by law, each public agency contract for services entered into or amended on or after July 1, 2016, must include:

(a) The following statement, in substantially the following form, identifying the contact information of the public agency’s custodian of public records in at least 14-point boldfaced type:

IF THE CONTRACTOR HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO THE CONTRACTOR’S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS CONTRACT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS AT (telephone number, e-mail address, and mailing address).

(b) A provision that requires the contractor to comply with public records laws, specifically to:

1. Keep and maintain public records required by the public agency to perform the service.
2. Upon request from the public agency’s custodian of public records, provide the public agency with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in this chapter or as otherwise provided by law.
3. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the contractor does not transfer the records to the public agency.
4. Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost, to the public agency all public records in possession of the contractor or keep and maintain public records required by the public agency to perform the service. If the contractor transfers all public records to the public agency upon completion of the contract, the contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. 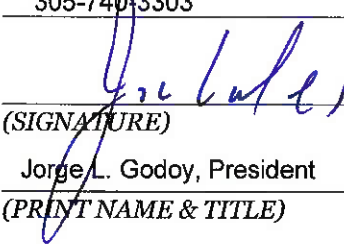

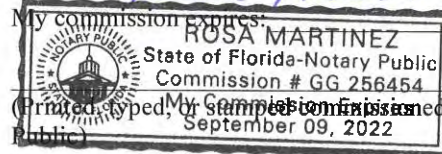

119.0701 Contracts; public records; request for contractor records; civil action. —

(1) DEFINITIONS. —For purposes of this section, the term:

(a) “Contractor” means an individual, partnership, corporation, or business entity that enters into a contract for services with a public agency and is acting on behalf of the public agency as provided under s. 119.011(2).

(b) “Public agency” means a state, county, district, authority, or municipal officer, or department, division, board, bureau, commission, or other separate unit of government created or established by law.

(2) CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS. —In addition to other contract requirements provided by law, each public agency contract for services entered into or amended on or after July 1, 2016, must include:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. PETE BEACH, FLORIDA AMENDING CHAPTER 22 – BOARDS, COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS, ARTICLE IV RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF THE CITY OF ST. PETE BEACH CODE OF ORDINANCES, SECTIONS 22-101, 22-102(a), 22-103(a), 22-104, 22-106, 22-107(a) & (b), 22-108(a), (b), & (e) AND 22-109 CHANGING THE RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO INCLUDE PARKS AND CHANGING THE YEARLY MEETING TIME OF THE COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS, SEVERABILITY, CONSTRUCTION, PUBLICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of St. Pete Beach wishes to change the name of the Recreation Advisory Committee to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee and to change the yearly meeting time from annually to bi-annually; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has found this ordinance to be in the best interest of the citizens of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ST. PETE BEACH FLORIDA, HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The above recitals (“Whereas” clauses) are hereby adopted as legislative findings, purpose and intent of the City Commission.

SECTION 2. Chapter 22 – Boards, Committees, Commissions, Article IV – Recreation Advisory Committee of the Code of Ordinances, City of St. Pete Beach, Florida is hereby amended as follows:

ARTICLE IV PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Sec. 22-101. - Created.

There is hereby created a permanent committee to be known as the parks and recreation advisory committee.

Sec. 22-102. - Number of members; compensation.

(a) The mayor and each city commissioner shall appoint one regular member to serve on the parks and recreation advisory committee.

Sec. 22-103. - Appointment of members.

(a) The mayor and each city commissioner shall appoint one regular member to serve on the parks and recreation advisory committee.

Sec. 22-104. - Term of office of members.

The terms of office of the members of the parks and recreation advisory committee shall run concurrently with the term of the mayor or commissioner appointing that member.

Sec. 22-106. - Removal from office.

(a) Members of the parks and recreation advisory committee shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing commission member.

(b) Any member who fails to attend three successive regular meetings shall forfeit membership on the parks and recreation advisory committee.

(c) If any member of the parks and recreation advisory committee resigns, or for any other reason ceases to be a member of the committee, the city commission member who appointed such member shall appoint a replacement to serve the remainder of the term.

Sec. 22-107. - Powers and duties generally.

(a) The parks and recreation advisory committee shall have the power to adopt rules and procedures and to conduct regular and special meetings, provided the procedures do not conflict with any requirements of the Charter or this Code.

(b) The parks and recreation advisory committee shall advise on programs, evaluate existing programs, propose new programs and make recommendations to the city staff and/or city commission regarding the following:

Sec. 22-108. - Election of officers; conduct of meetings.

(a) The parks and recreation advisory committee shall meet ~~annually~~ bi-annually, at the first meeting held following the appointment of members, organize by electing a chairman and vice-chairman and such other officers as may be necessary from among its members.

(b) The parks and recreation advisory committee shall meet ~~quarterly~~ bi-annually, with the time and place to be established by majority vote of the regular members. All meetings shall be open to the public.

(c) Special meetings may be called and held upon the request of the chairman, city commission, city manager or his/her designee or by any three members during a properly noticed public meeting.

(d) A quorum for the conduct of business shall not be less than three members.

(e) A majority of committee members present shall be required to make any determination required by the parks and recreation advisory committee.

Sec. 22-109. - Staff participation and responsibilities.

The city shall make available staff to assist the parks and recreation advisory committee in the performance of its duties. Responsibilities will include the recording and transcribing of the minutes of all meetings of the committee. All meetings of the committee shall be open to the public. A public record of the committee's minutes and resolutions shall be maintained and made available for inspection by the public

SECTION 3. Conflicts. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict with the Ordinance.

SECTION 4. Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable, and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance but they shall remain in effect, it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

SECTION 5. Construction. This Ordinance is to be liberally construed to accomplish its objectives.

SECTION 6. Publication. This Ordinance shall be published in accordance with the requirements of law.

SECTION 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-23

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. PETE BEACH, AMENDING THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE, DIVISION 6 – SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS, SECTION 6.25 – MOBILE FOOD ESTABLISHMENT; AND AMENDING APPENDIX “A” OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REDUCE THE COST OF A MOBILE FOOD ESTABLISHMENT PERMIT, PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Commission recognizes that mobile food vending is a specialized use with a specialized market; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of St. Pete Beach periodically finds sections in its Land Development Code which require clarification, updating and/or amending; and

WHEREAS, the City’s Land Development Code also serves to maintain an environment conducive to the health, safety, welfare of the City’s residents, and preserves and enhances property values within the City; and

WHEREAS, on October 21, 2019, the City’s Planning Board sitting as the Local Planning Agency held a public hearing to consider the proposed Land Development Code changes and provided recommendations to the City Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has found this ordinance to be in the best interest, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City and

WHEREAS, notice of this ordinance has been provided in accordance with applicable law.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ST. PETE BEACH FLORIDA, HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The above recitals (“Whereas” clauses) are hereby adopted as legislative findings, purpose and intent of the City Commission.

SECTION 2. The provisions in this Section pertaining to the City’s Land Development Code are amended as follows:

Division 6, Sec. 6.25 (Mobile food establishment) shall be amended as follows:

It is a violation to vend any product from a mobile food truck at any location except in compliance with the requirements of this section.

- (a) *Vehicle requirements.* A mobile food truck shall not be used for vending a product unless the vehicle has been designed and constructed specifically for such purpose. The mobile food truck shall be licensed in accordance with the rules and regulations of any local, state and federal agency having jurisdiction over the mobile food truck or products sold therein.
- (b) *Special event permits.* Mobile food trucks may be permitted in public rights-of-way, or on public property, in conjunction with a special event permit as regulated in this section. Operation of mobile food trucks on public property or within public rights-of-way for special events is permitted, subject to approval of the City Commission.
- (bc) *Insurance requirements.*
- (1) *Operating in rights-of-way.* The permittee, owner or operator shall at all times maintain any insurance which the city determines to be necessary, which may include but is not limited to, general liability insurance, commercial automobile liability insurance, worker's compensation insurance, and environmental liability insurance, issued by an insurance company licensed to do business in the State of Florida, in the amounts established by the city which shall be reasonable, based on industry standards and the risk determined to exist. The insurance policy shall be in occurrence form and the City of St. Pete Beach shall be named as an additional insured on the certificate of insurance. The permittee, owner or operator shall furnish the city with a certificate of insurance which shall be accepted by the city only after approval by the city commission. The permittee, owner or operator shall notify the city within three (3) business days of any changes in the insurance coverage. Upon the cancellation or lapse of any policy of insurance as required by this section, the permit shall be immediately revoked unless, prior to the expiration or cancellation date of the insurance policy, another insurance policy meeting all the requirements of the city is obtained and a new certificate of insurance is provided to the city.
 - (2) *Operating in all other locations, not in rights-of-way.* A mobile food truck shall obtain at a minimum, the insurance as required by any local, state or federal laws and regulations.
 - (3) *City issued permit (as defined herein).* In addition to the insurance requirements set forth in this section, a mobile food truck shall obtain any additional insurance which may be required to obtain a city issued permit (as defined herein).
- (ed) *Open flame cooking.* Open flame cooking is prohibited; except that such activity may take place if permitted by the city fire marshal.
- (de) *Noise limitations.* Amplified music shall be prohibited; any other sounds from any mobile food truck shall comply with the noise requirements of the city.

- (ef) *Waste collection.* The operator shall provide a waste receptacle for public use within 100 feet of the truck. The area shall be kept neat and orderly at all times and garbage or trash shall be removed daily.
- (fg) *Improved surface.* Food trucks shall only operate from and be located on an improved surface at least 5 feet off the public right-of-way.
- (gh) *Signage.* All signage must comply with the sign section of the Land Development Code. In no case shall "A-frame" signs be permitted.
- (hi) *Alcohol sales.* Mobile food trucks are prohibited from selling alcoholic beverages, except as may be specifically allowed by a city issued permit in conjunction with a special event.
- (ij) *Business tax receipt.* A mobile food establishment permit is issued concurrent with the business tax receipt (BTR) confirmation. If an applicant is a resident of the City of St. Pete Beach, they will be required to obtain a BTR from the city.
- (jk) *Restroom facility.* ~~Class I~~ Mobile food trucks operating at a site for a duration of more than three (3) hours shall have a written agreement, available upon request by the city, which confirms that employees have access to a flushable restroom within 150 feet of the vending location during the hours of operation.
- (kl) *Grease disposal.* ~~Class I~~ Mobile food trucks shall have a current written agreement for the proper disposal of grease, available upon request by the city.
- (lm) *Location.* The vending of products from a Class I mobile food truck on public rights-of-way shall be prohibited unless in conjunction with a special event permit. The vending of products from a ~~Class I~~ mobile food truck on private lands shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - (1) *Private property.* The vending of products from a ~~Class I~~ mobile food truck on private property, in conjunction with an established business is permitted only as a conditional use in zoning districts of the city as outlined herein.
 - (2) *Vacant property.* Operation of a ~~Class I~~ mobile food truck is prohibited on vacant and unimproved property.
 - (3) *Permission.* A ~~Class I~~ mobile food truck shall have the written permission of the owner of the property on which it is located. Such written permission shall accompany application for the mobile food truck permit.
 - (4) *Frequency.* Except as may be allowed as part of a special event permit, mobile food trucks are permitted on each property, a maximum of no more than three (3) days per calendar week. ~~Class I~~ mobile food trucks may operate at different locations as allowed herein.

- (5) *Maximum number of mobile food trucks.* No more than two (2) mobile food trucks shall operate on any property at any one (1) time, except as may be allowed by a special event permit.
- (6) *Parking.* Mobile food trucks shall not be required to provide additional parking on the principal business site. If a mobile food truck parks in a principal business required off-street provided space(s), then the principal business shall provide evidence, in the form of a site plan indicating that on-street parking exists within 800 feet of the establishment.
- (7) *Access.* A ~~Glass~~ mobile food truck shall not be placed in any location that impedes the ingress or egress or building entrances or emergency exits.
- (8) *Hours of operation.* ~~Glass~~ mobile food trucks shall be permitted to operate after 7:00 a.m. and before 10 p.m. The request for extended hours must be reviewed and approved by the city subject to the criteria contained in the application.
- (9) *Power.* Power for all ~~Glass~~ mobile food trucks will be evaluated on a case by case basis during the conditional use process but in no case shall a generator be used within 200 feet of a residential district.
- (~~mn~~) *CUP expiration.* The conditional use permit shall automatically expire if the principal business does not hold a valid business tax receipt from the city.

SECTION 3. "Appendix A" of the Code of Ordinance is hereby amended as illustrated in "Exhibit A," which is attached and made a part of this Ordinance.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

Ordinance No, 2019-xx pertains to Mobile food establishments (mobile food trucks). Language addressing operations of mobile food establishments is being revised to clarify operations of vehicles regarding special events and permit non-customary operations of food trucks on private property at special events taking place in the City's downtown commercial districts.

CONSISTENCY WITH THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN – STAFF REVIEW AND LPA

Staff has reviewed the proposed Ordinance and find it to be consistent with the City of St. Pete Beach's Comprehensive Plan specifically as follows:

FUTURE LAND USE ELEMENT

GOAL 2:

The City shall ensure that the residential character of the City of St. Pete Beach is maintained and protected while:

- Maximizing the potential for economic benefit resulting from the tourist trade and the enjoyment of natural and man-made resources by residents and visitors alike.
- Minimizing the threat to health, safety, and welfare posed by hazards, nuisances, incompatible land uses, and environmental degradation.
- Maintaining the community's recreation, open space and beaches.

Community Redevelopment District general redevelopment guidelines, standards and initiatives

- (a) 2. Ensure that a comprehensive redevelopment strategy can be and shall be implemented through land development regulations that maintain the City's

heritage of quality residential living complemented by resort facilities and supported by a tourist-based economy that includes temporary lodging uses, local retail, restaurants and local pubs and bars;

Goals, Objectives and Policies for the Downtown Redevelopment District

GOAL 1:

The downtown commercial core of the District shall be a community gathering place that attracts people to the area with living, working, shopping, entertainment and recreational opportunities. The City shall encourage revitalization through redevelopment that is designed to attract residents and visitors to Downtown core community destination. The downtown residential neighborhoods surrounding and within walking distance of the Downtown core area, are encouraged to redevelop in a manner that enhances pedestrian and non-vehicular mobility.

Objective 1.4

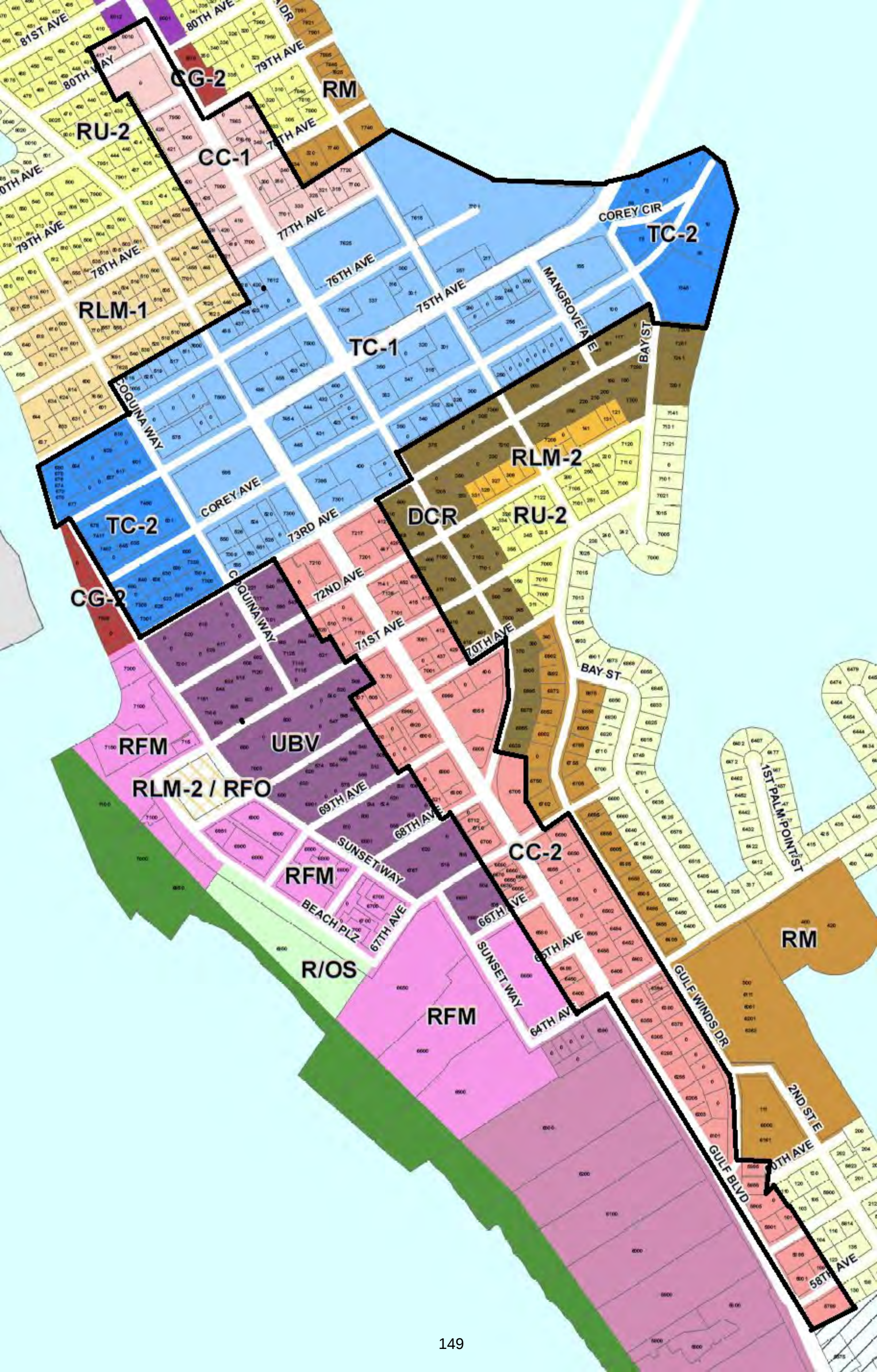
The City shall use all existing incentives to encourage an affordable mix of housing types and varieties that are located within walking distance of the downtown Corey Avenue core area integrated with retail, commercial, office and entertainment uses at street level to create a live, shop, work and play environment in the Corey downtown area that will revitalize the traditional main street as a vibrant center of activity for residents and visitors.

The City shall recognize the unique features of Downtown neighborhoods and shall continue to expand neighborhood retail, business, and recreation services.

Issue Considered: First Reading and Public Hearing. An Ordinance of the City of St. Pete Beach, Florida providing for supplemental budget appropriations to the General, Capital, Wastewater, Reclaimed Water, and Stormwater Funds derived from prior year funding availability.

Summary of Issue: The intent of this ordinance is to provide supplemental budget appropriations derived from prior year funding availability. The ordinance includes revenue re-appropriations, adopted re-appropriations, encumbrances, unencumbered balances, and new requests, all totaling \$24,983,862 in gross revenue and expenditures.

Revenue re-appropriations totaling \$6,940,480 reflect external funding sources directly related to capital project implementation schedules, with revenue collection contingent upon construction progress. Examples include Gulf Boulevard beautification funding, Southwest Florida Water Management District grants, and Pinellas County joint project agreements.

Adopted re-appropriations including \$9,160,426 refer to projects that were temporarily paused in the fourth quarter of FY 2019 to include expenditure authority in the FY 2020 adopted budget. Authorization has already been granted for these items via the budget adoption process; however, they are specified in the ordinance for balancing purposes.

Encumbrances (i.e., purchase orders) totaling \$5,328,562 include active projects and pending services that would otherwise be impacted by the fiscal year closing process. These balances will remain available for spending without interruption.

Unencumbered balances of \$2,118,078 represent available funds where FY 2019 budgeted appropriations were not fully executed (i.e., expended or encumbered). Funding will continue to be applied to the originally identified projects. These funds would otherwise be retained and close to fund balance if not appropriated.

New requests include supplemental appropriations for current projects or acquisitions that were unplanned or under-funded during the budget adoption process. These funds would be retained and close to fund balance if not appropriated. Specific requests are itemized below, totaling \$1,436,316:

- Sanitary sewer expansion: \$531,416
- Library improvements: \$400,000
- Hurley Park improvements: \$200,000
- Fishing piers: \$125,000
- Corey Avenue landscaping: \$100,000
- Fire Department air tank equipment: \$30,000
- Personnel changes: \$30,900
- Code enforcement vehicle: \$19,000

The net effect of all proposed changes is to increase total fund balance by \$121,311 as compared to budgeted estimates, including the following fund-level impacts:

- General Fund: \$45,879
- Capital Fund: \$45,795

WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2020 budget includes revenue and expenditures as adopted by Ordinance 2019-15; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of St. Pete Beach desires to amend the fiscal year 2020 budget; and

WHEREAS, Article III, Section 3.13(a) of the City Charter provides authority for appropriation amendments; and

Issue Considered: First Reading and Public Hearing. An Ordinance of the City of St. Pete Beach, Florida providing for supplemental budget appropriations to the Wastewater Fund related to the Sanitary Sewer Expansion Project.

Summary of Issue: The intent of this ordinance is to provide sufficient funding for the sanitary sewer expansion project. Based on the December 20, 2019 bid opening, estimated construction costs exceed the budget by approximately \$4.47 million. Following are staff's recommended budgetary actions to complete the project fund:

1. Reduce contingency estimates from ten percent to five percent. This is based on Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) policy to limit contingency funding upon completion of the construction bidding process. In the event actual contingency expenses exceed five percent, the State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan agreement will be amended to include additional funds.
2. Appropriate \$531,416 as included in a corresponding ordinance on the January 14th agenda. This provides additional funding derived from prior year budget availability, with no negative impact to fund balance.
3. Transfer \$531,142 from budgeted debt service expense to the project fund. Based on the final SRF loan agreement, the first debt service payment is deferred to fiscal year 2022. This represents an intra-fund transfer utilizing existing resources, with no adverse impact to fund balance as compared to budgetary estimates.
4. Utilize \$256,465 in Wastewater fund balance which would have otherwise been applied towards fiscal year 2021 debt service expense. Based on the deferred loan payment schedule, these funds will not be required until fiscal year 2022.
5. Borrow the remaining balance of \$2,880,631 as required to complete the project fund. Staff recommends borrowing the difference, particularly due to the final loan terms which include a fixed interest rate of 0.22%. The net difference between the original loan terms (\$10,350,317 at 0.835%) and final loan terms (\$13,230,948 at 0.22%) is

approximately \$114,159 per year. An option remains available for staff to reduce the rate to 0.12%, which would further reduce the annual impact by \$6,718.

Funding: The requested changes bring the loan balance to \$13,230,948, which will be funded by Wastewater service fees. Staff estimates tentatively assume two additional seven percent rate increases in fiscal years 2021 and 2022, respectively. Under current expenditure assumptions, the planned rate increases are sufficient to fund the annual debt service requirement of \$676,269. Staff estimates do not presume new connection fee revenue.
