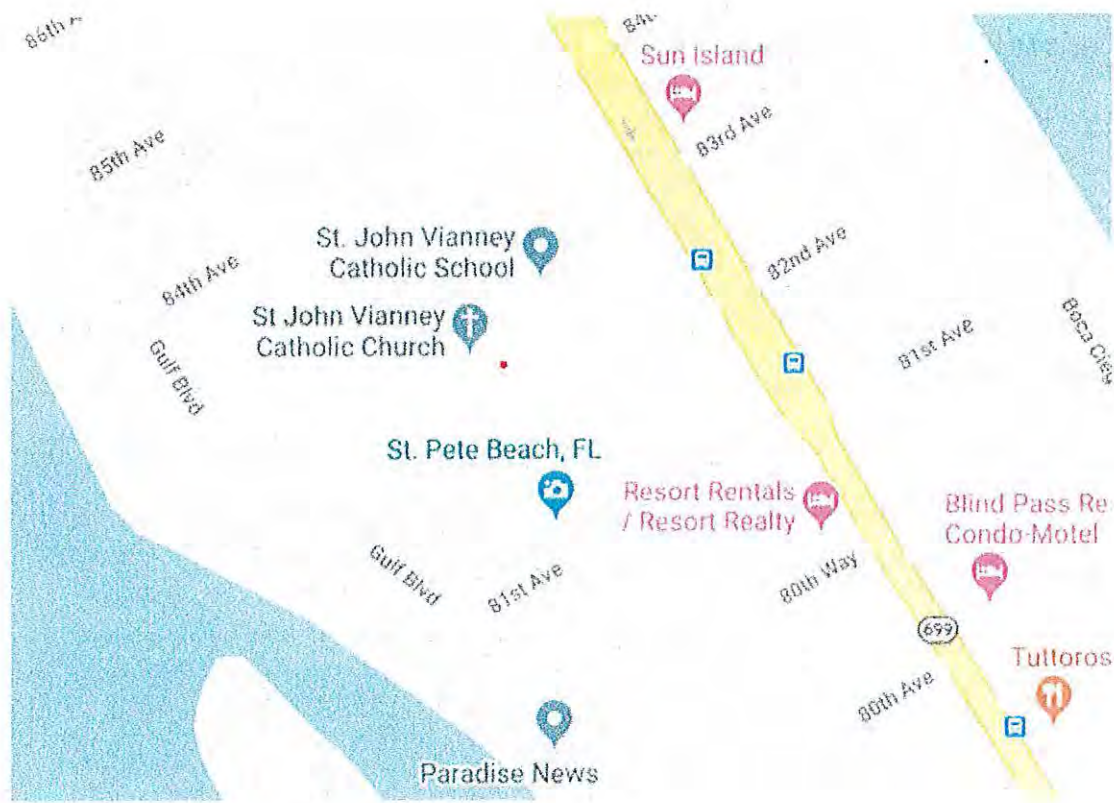

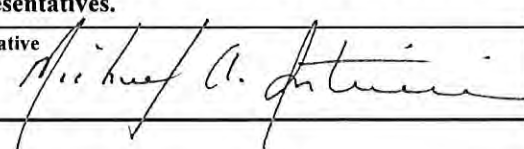

About the Museum

A Hidden Treasure on the Beach

Settled on the grounds of the first church of the local barrier islands, is the Gulf Beaches Historical Museum. Built in 1917 of rusticated block the Pass-a-Grille Community Church was a staple of the growing island town throughout the years. But in 1959 it's membership outgrew the small building and a new church was built on 16th Avenue in the Pass-a-Grille area of St. Pete Beach.



Bound for the wrecking ball, the property was saved by Joan Haley, a social editor, preservationist and socialite from Washington, D.C. moving here in 1952. She loved the island and became involved immediately in the community. Her sense of preservation, love of antiques and the area, prompted her to sell her Bayfront property, purchase the old church and make it her very special home. Upon her death in 1989 she left the church property to Pinellas County to be used as an island Museum.

After updating, cleaning and refurbishing the new Museum opened to the public in March, 1993. A non-profit support organization was formed, volunteers were recruited, artifacts gathered and with hard work the Museum has grown, expanded to become a real island treasure. It is totally manned by volunteers. It's Mission statement is "To collect, preserve and exhibit the history of the barrier islands."

Inside there is a time-line display from 1500 to present, artifacts from the Sunshine School, Gulf Beaches School, island churches, Haley's personal memorabilia, hundreds of then and now photographs, post-cards, a WW II exhibit, a special Don CeSar Hotel display and always a special exhibit that changes yearly.



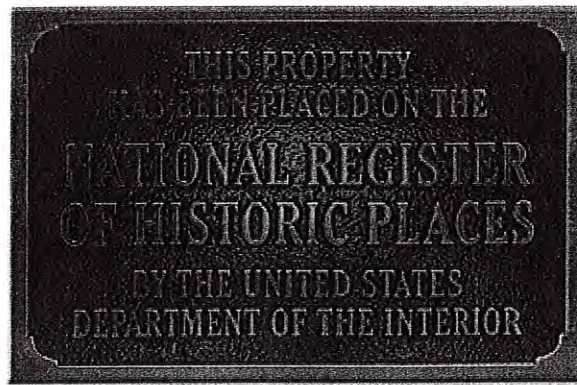

New items are added regularly throughout the Museum as donations continue to come in, adding to the collection. There are over 35 albums of different pioneer families, clubs and island events over the past 100 years.

The Friends support group has fund-raisers, there is gift shop inside with lots of historic books, brochures, jewelry and small gift items.

Looking for a fun and informative afternoon activity, stop out at the Gulf Beaches Historical Museum. There is no admission fee, it is handicap accessible and there is lots and lots to see inside and outside in the large, shady yard. Learn about local island heritage, meet dedicated volunteers (better yet, ask about joining them) and help with the Museum mission of "collecting, preserving and exhibiting the history of the barrier islands".

Issue Considered: Request approval to sign a statement of “no objection” for the property owner to the south of the 83rd Ave street-end owned by the City for the setting of pilings to create a wet slip that encroaches into the 83rd Ave street-end setback.

Summary of Issue On January 24, 2020, the applicant submitted a dock permit application and variance request form for the installation of six (6) new pilings to create a wet slip on the northern side of the dock at 8225 Boca Ciega Drive. Four (4) of the pilings will encroach into the required northern side setback from the 83rd Ave street-end, which is owned by the City.

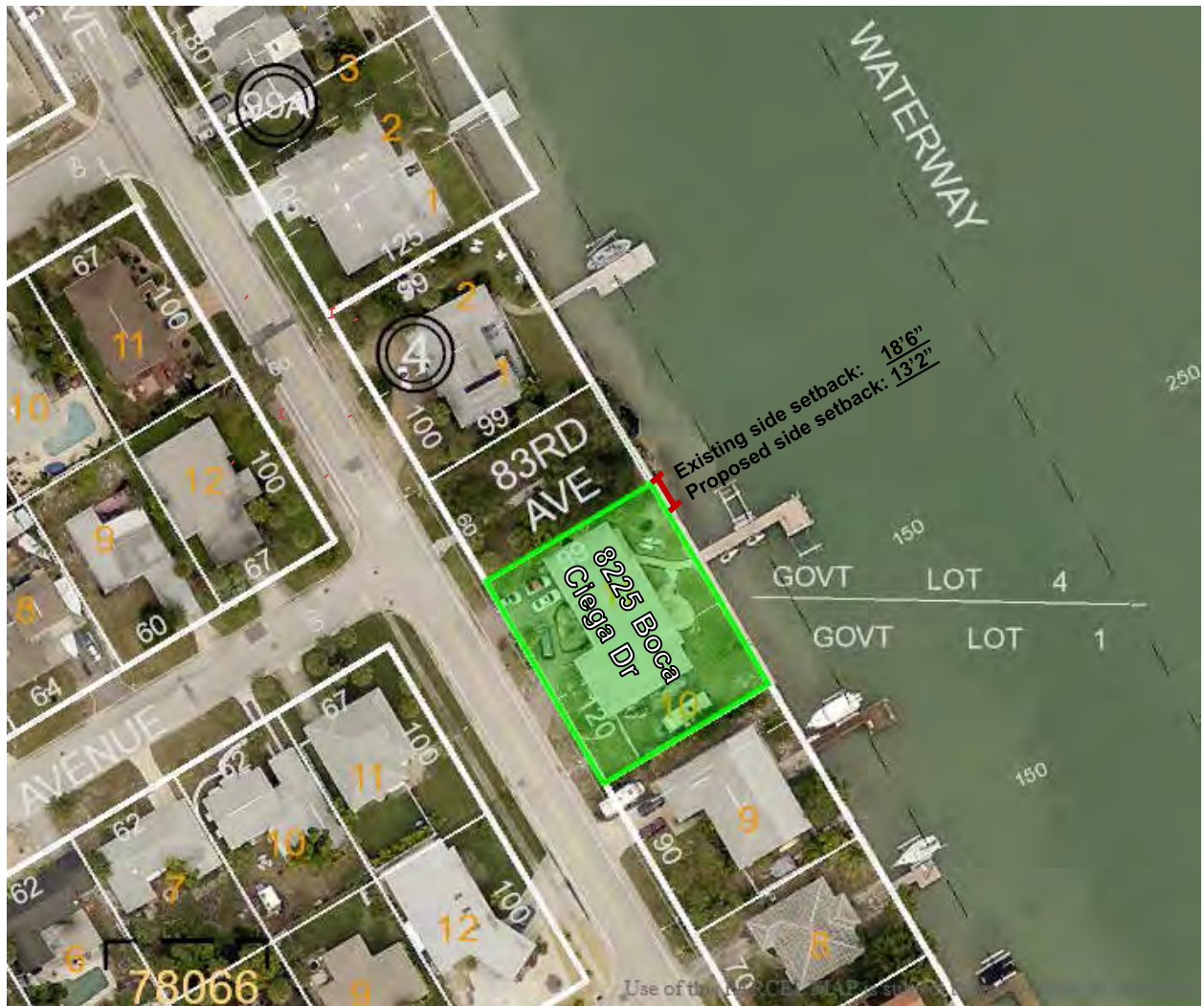
The City’s regulations specify that the pilings must be in the center half or 30 feet from the 83rd Ave street-end right-of-way. The applicant formerly received approval for a boat lift that encroached 11’6” into the northern setback, which will be removed to accommodate this new wet slip. The wet slip pilings for installation on the northern side are proposed to encroach 16’10” into this required side setback, resulting in a setback of 13’2” from the extended property line. The required side setback (30 feet) can be varied administratively provided that a signed statement of “no objection” is received from the City. If the applicant receives approval by the City, the piling installation will be approved for zoning.

Requested Motion: “I move to approve the City Manager to sign the “no objection” statement for the property owner to the south of the 83rd Ave street-end to install residential wet slip pilings that encroach 16’10” into the side setback for the property located at 8225 Boca Ciega Dr.”

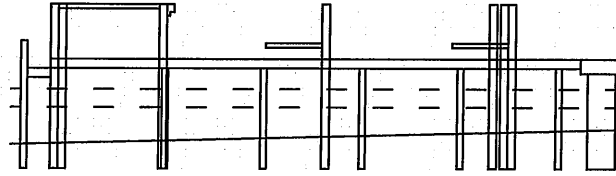

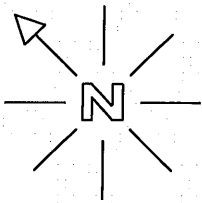

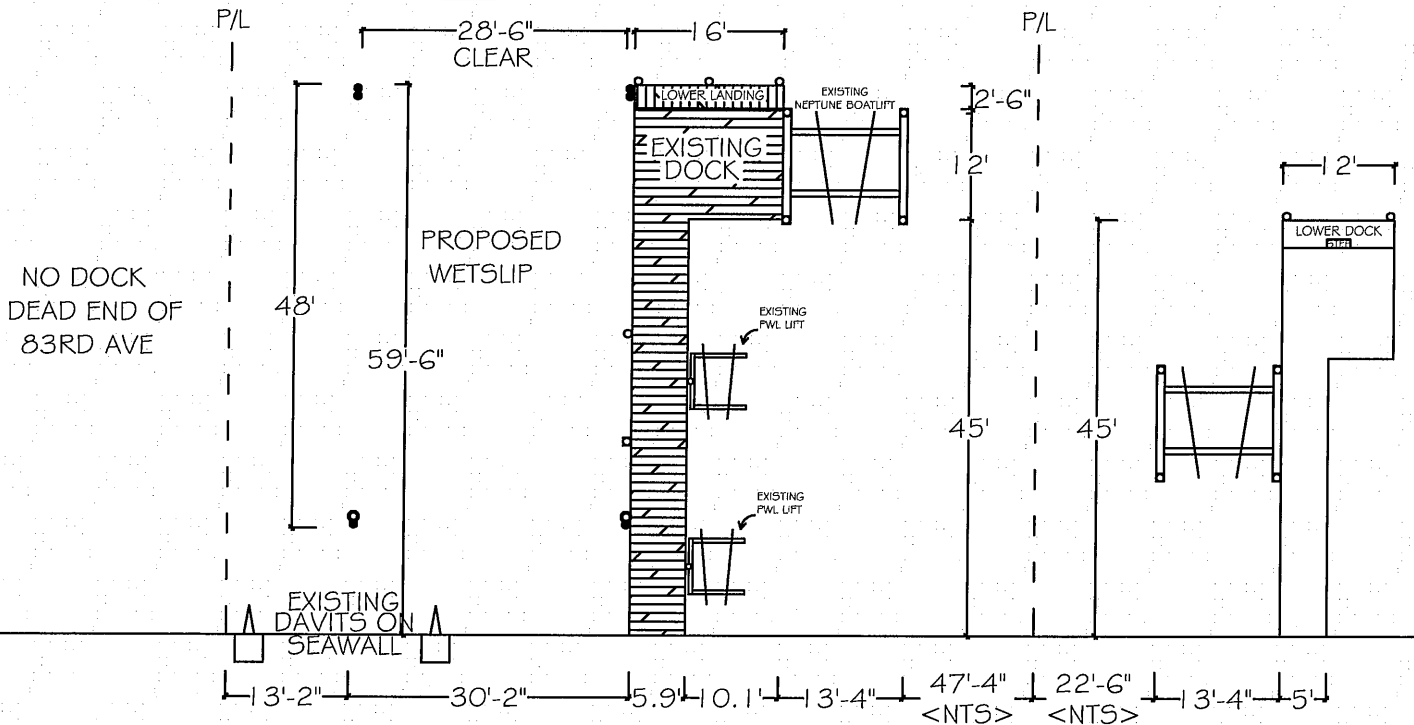

Sec. 6.23. - Docks.

Section 6.23 Docks.

It is the intent of the city, together with the Pinellas County Water and Navigation Control Authority, to regulate the construction of residential and commercial dock facilities in order to minimize the adverse impacts of such activities upon the natural resources of the City of St. Pete Beach, Pinellas County and the State of Florida.

(d) *Additional requirements for residential docks.* In addition to the preceding general requirements, residential docks shall adhere to the following:

(1) No residential dock shall be designed or constructed to accommodate more than two boats for permanent mooring. No residential zoning lot shall have more than one dock. For the purpose of this section, personal watercraft (wave runners or jet skis) lifts shall not be considered a boat slip.

(2) Notwithstanding the preceding, a residential dock for the joint use by two or more adjacent waterfront property owners may be permitted where the physical characteristics of the waterfront make it impractical to build individual docks.

(3) No residential dock, davits, boatlifts or tie poles shall extend from the mean high water line or seawall of the appurtenant upland property to a length greater than one-half the width of the zoning lot at the waterfront. This requirement may be varied administratively provided that signed statements of "no objection" from both adjacent waterfront property owners have been submitted.

(4) Residential dock, davits, boatlifts or tie poles shall be located within the center one-half of the width of the appurtenant upland property at the waterfront. For the purpose of this regulation, side lot lines of a lot shall be deemed to extend into the adjacent water body perpendicular to the shoreline which they intersect. This requirement may be varied administratively provided that a signed statement of "no objection" from the property owner encroached upon has been submitted with the permit application.

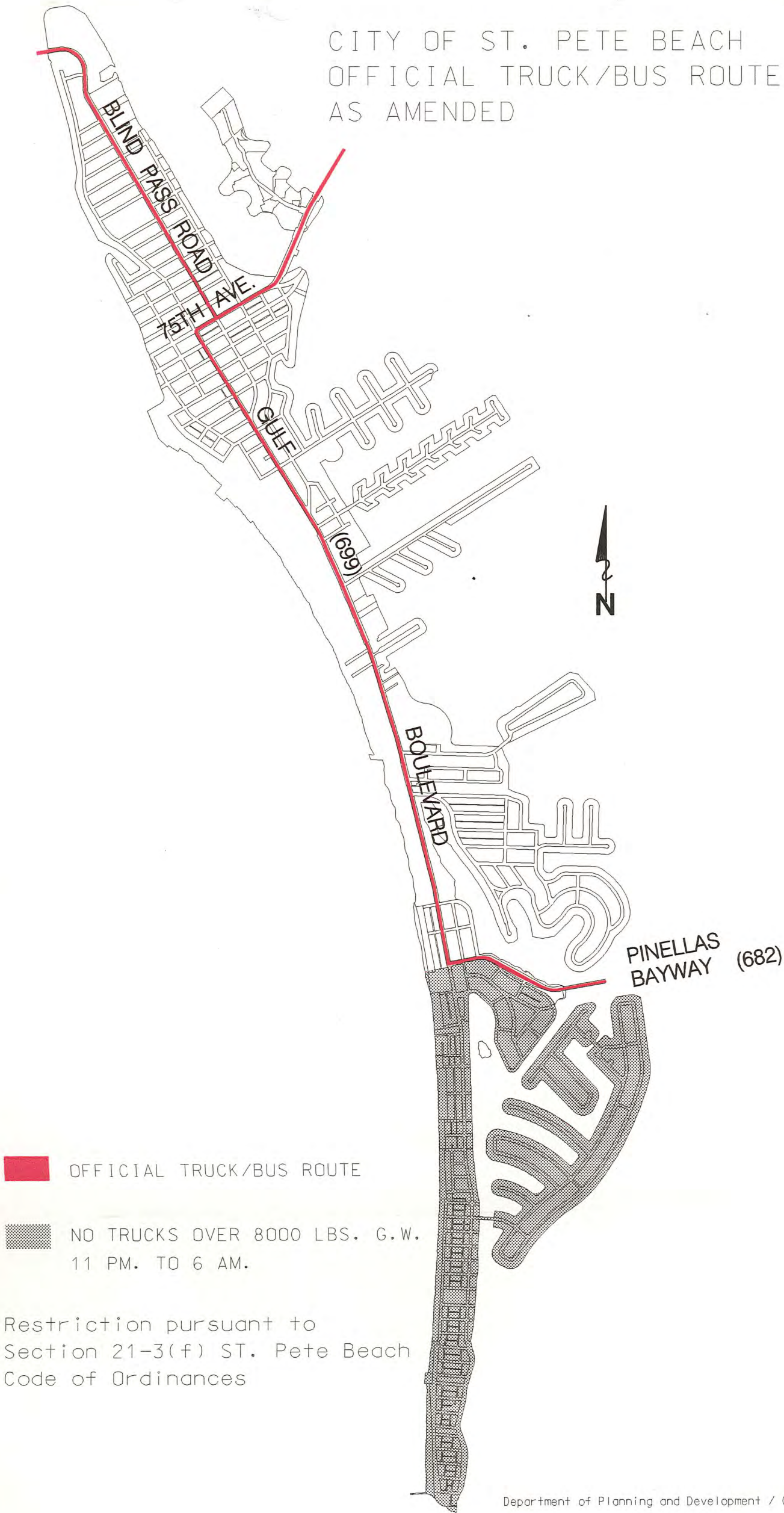
